Course Description

TCM134: Introduction to elements of pre-production for motion picture and television. Focuses on aesthetics, scriptwriting, budgeting, and selecting cast and crew. Features pre-production meetings to establish style, location, art design, shot sheet/story board, sound design, shooting schedule and film stock/video tapes. Pre-production of one film project and one video project required. Working as crew on one class shoot required.

TCM135: Introduction to elements of production for motion picture and television. Focuses on directing, crew responsibilities, camera operation, lenses, lighting and sound recording. Production of one film shoot and one video shoot required.

Prerequisites

TCM134: A grade of C or better in TCM100, or TCM/VPT105, or permission of Department or Division.

TCM135: A grade of C or better in TCM134, or permission of Department or Division.

Course Competencies

- 8. Apply principles of pre-production for motion picture and television by functioning as crew. (VIII)

TCM135:

- 1. Direct actors and crew on one film shoot and one digital shoot. (I)
- 2. Apply principles of production to student film shoots and digital shoots by functioning as crew. (I)
- 3. Identify and describe the major components of a film and digital camera. (II)
- 4. Demonstrate effective operation of film and digital cameras. (II)
- 5. Identify a variety of lenses and select and use the appropriate lens for specific situations. (III)
- 6. Design a lighting scheme for one film shoot and one digital shoot. (IV)
- 7. Demonstrate camera movement using hand-held, tripod and dollies. (V)
- 8. Identify and describe the major components of sound equipment. (VI)
- 9. Operate sound equipment. (VI)
- 10. Complete one film shoot and one digital shoot. (I-VI)
- 11. Identify and describe basic studio production procedures. (VII)
